

ORDINANCE 10-268

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING THE RIGHT TO A STANDING COMMITTEE FOR THE WATERSHED ADVISORY BOARD.

WHEREAS: Resolution #94-3 established a Tenmile Lakes Watershed Council on January 13, 1994.

WHEREAS: The Watershed Council members is a City of Lakeside committee.

WHEREAS: The Watershed Council members must be a diverse group from the community and may include representatives of the following areas:

- a. local government
- b. non-government organizations
- c. private citizens including but not limited to:
 - i. Representatives of local and regional boards, commissions, and agencies;
 - ii. Indian Tribes;
 - iii. Public interest group representatives;
 - ix. Private landowners;
 - x. Industry representatives;
 - xi. Labor representatives; and
 - xii. Academic, scientific and professional community.

THE CITY OF LAKESIDE ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: PURPOSE: It is the intent of this ordinance to provide for the Watershed Council to become a standing committee. To these ends, this ordinance seeks to supplement Resolution #94-3 and to provide terms for members residing on the Watershed Council in the City of Lakeside.

SECTION 2: The Watershed Council will operate under the Oregon Public Meetings Law.

SECTION 3: The members of this Board/committee shall remain in their position for a period of no longer than 2 years. At that time, their seat must go in front of the City Council for a renewal period of 2 years. They **MUST** contact the City Council, in writing, 60 days prior to the end of their term and tell the Council if they intend to reapply for the seat or not. If they wish to reapply, they **MUST** do so in this letter to the Council. This provides the Council with time to post Notice to the public of the opening of the position. Any other person fitting that particular seats qualification category may also apply for that seat by writing a letter to the Council at least 60 days prior to that term.

SECTION 4: Such current member ending their term may also apply to fill a different vacant seat, if applicable, if they meet the criteria for such seat. For example: an

industry representative may lose his seat after a two year term but may apply for a private landowner's vacant seat if he/she owns land in Lakeside and/or vice versa.

SECTION 5: Upon its initial meeting after this ordinance the Watershed Council Board shall elect a chairperson from its current members to serve no more than 2 years, continuous.

SECTION 6: This Ordinance shall become effective 30 days upon its passage by the City Council and approval by the Mayor.

FIRST READ to the Council the 8th day of April, 2010.

PASSED by the Council this 13th day of May, 2010.

SIGNED by the Mayor this 13th day of May, 2010.
