

ORDINANCE NO. 119

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE CALLING OF A CITY TAX LEVY ELECTION IN THE CITY OF LAKESIDE, OREGON ON MAY 19, 1987 FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE LEGAL VOTERS OF THE CITY OF LAKESIDE, OREGON, THE QUESTION OF ESTABLISHING A THREE-YEAR, FIXED-DOLLAR SERIAL LEVY FOR POLICE PROTECTION

WHEREAS, Article XI, Section 11 of the Oregon Constitution allows for such an election and applies limitations on taxation, and

WHEREAS, The City Council of the City of Lakeside, Oregon has determined that a three-year serial tax levy should be established as authorized by Subsection (3) (b) of Section 11 of Article XI of the Oregon Constitution, in order to permit the proper operation of the city affairs within the limitation contained therein, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to submit the question of establishing a three-year serial levy to the legal voters of the City of Lakeside, Oregon.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF LAKESIDE ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Date of Election. The proposition set forth in Section 2 of this ordinance shall be submitted in the manner prescribed in this ordinance to the legal voters of the City of Lakeside, Oregon at a city tax levy election to be held on May 19, 1987.

Section 2. Form of Proposition. At the city tax levy election there shall be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Lakeside, Oregon for their approval or rejection, the following proposition:

ESTABLISHING A THREE-YEAR OPERATING LEVY FOR POLICE PROTECTION

QUESTION: Shall the City of Lakeside levy \$23,307.00 each year outside the zero tax base for operations beginning in 1987-88?

EXPLANATION: The City of Lakeside has no tax base (a zero tax base) and no other funds for providing police protection. This three-year fixed-dollar serial levy will provide for up to one full-time patrol officer within the city limits beginning July, 1987. The total amount of the proposed levy is \$69,921.00, which is to be levied in equal amounts of \$23,307.00 in each of the three years. These funds must by law be placed in a special fund and used only for the purpose stated, which is police protection.

Section 3. Election Part of Statewide Primary Election. There is a regular statewide primary election being held in the State of Oregon and in the City of Lakeside on May 19, 1987 and this city tax levy election is called to be held concurrent therewith, and as a part thereof.

Section 4. Election Boards. The city tax levy election shall be handled by, and the city tax levy ballots counted by, the same election boards that handle the regular statewide primary election in the election precincts, in which the City of Lakeside is located, at the regular statewide primary election to be held on May 19, 1987. Such election boards hereby are designated as the election boards for the city tax levy election and shall hold their respective offices as designated for the regular statewide primary election.

Section 5. Voting Hours. The polls for the city tax levy election shall be opened in each of the voting precincts at the same hour, and shall be kept open until the same hour, as the polls are opened and closed for the regular statewide primary election that will be held on the same day.

Section 6. Qualified Voters. The election boards handling the election shall permit only those electors to vote on the question of establishing a three-year serial tax levy who are otherwise qualified to vote at the regular statewide primary election and who reside within the boundaries of the City of Lakeside.

Section 7. Notice of Election. Notice of the city tax levy election shall be given by publication once in The World newspaper, a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Coos Bay, Oregon. This publication shall be handled by the Coos County Elections Department and will be a part of the sample ballot published in The World. Notice of the city tax levy election shall also be posted for not less than 20 days before the election in at least three public places within the city. The notice in the newspaper and that posted in at least three public places shall be in substantially the form contained in Section 2. Form of Proposition.

This Ordinance No. 119 duly adopted by the City Council of the City of Lakeside on this 19th day of March, 1987. This ordinance shall take effect on April 18, 1987, the thirtieth day after its enactment.
