

CITY OF LAKESIDE

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING VEHICULAR PARKING;

The City of Lakeside ordains as follows:

Section 1.

- A. All motor vehicles parked on any public street in the City of Lakeside shall be positioned along the right side of the street as determined from the position of the driver of said vehicle when it is being operated in a legal manner, parallel with the curb line thereof, as close to such curb line as is practicable except as set forth in subsections B and C hereof.
- B. All motor vehicles parked on 8th Street South of North Lake Street and on North Lake between 8th and 9th Street shall be positioned along the right side of said street as determined from the position of the driver of said vehicle when it is being operated in a legal manner at an angle of 45 degrees as measured from the curb line, and with the right front wheel of said vehicle against the curb of said street.
- C. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection A and B of this section, vehicles, while actually being used in the loading or discharge of cargo within said City, may be backed into the curbing or double parked unless otherwise directed by the Chief of Police or any other police officer of the City.

Section 2.

It shall be unlawful to stop or park a motor vehicle except when necessary to avoid interference with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a police officer or traffic control signal, in any of the following places:

- a. Within an intersection.
- b. Within a crosswalk.
- c. Within 25 feet of the intersection of curb lines or, if none, within 15 feet of the intersection of property lines at an intersection

with a business or residential district,
except at alleys..

- d. Within 30 feet of any official flashing beacon, stop sign, or traffic control signal located at the side of the roadway.
- e. Within 15 feet of the driveway entrance to any fire station.
- f. Within 10 feet of a fire hydrant.
- g. In front of a private driveway.
- h. On a sidewalk or in an area which is parallel to the street and customarily used by pedestrians.
- i. Alongside or opposite any street or highway excavation or obstruction when such stopping, standing, or parking would obstruct traffic.
- j. On the roadway side of any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge or curb of a highway or street.
- k. At any place where official traffic signs have been erected prohibiting standing and parking.
- l. Within a 25 feet radius of the intersection of the centerline of a highway and a railway crossing.
- m. So as to cause said vehicle to occupy more than one designated parking stall in areas where said stalls are indicated by markings on the street or curb.

Section 3.

It shall be unlawful for the driver of any truck to stand or park any such vehicle on any street in such way or manner that any part of such vehicle, truck, or trailer shall project or be more distance than 15 feet into the street from the face of the curb nearest to any such vehicle when the distance is measured at right angles with such curb except as allowed in Section 1, C.

Section 4.

As used in this ordinance:

- A. "Motor Vehicle" means every self-propelled vehicle and vehicle designated for self-propulsion.
- B. "Holidays" shall mean (1) New Year's Day on January 1; (2) Memorial Day on the last Monday in May; (3) Independence Day on July 4; (4) Labor Day on the first Monday in September; (5) Thanksgiving Day on the fourth Thursday in November; (6) Christmas Day on December 25. If any such holiday at any time fall on Sunday, the succeeding Monday shall be a holiday in that year.
- C. "Truck" shall mean a truck tractor, with a trailer, semi-trailer, or pole trailer attached or in any manner carried on said truck tractor, or any truck having a load capacity of one and one-half tons or more, as those vehicles are defined by the State of Oregon motor vehicle code.
- D. Unless a word is specifically defined otherwise in this section, the definitions of words in ORS chapters 481 and 487 are hereby adopted and apply to this ordinance.

Section 5.

- A. It shall be unlawful for a person, firm, or corporation to stand or park any motor vehicle upon the street or parts of streets hereinafter designated for a continuous period of time in excess of two hours between the hours of 9:00 o'clock a.m. and 6:00 p.m. of each and every day except Sundays and holidays, to wit:
 - 1. As designated and posted by City
- B. It shall be unlawful for a person, firm or corporation to stand or park any trailer upon any street for a period in excess of 72 hours or as designated by the City.

Section 6:

Temporary permits may be issued for trucks other than equipment being used in construction projects within the City when the permittee applicant demonstrates that it is essential to the completion of the project that such vehicles be permitted to stand overnight upon a City street. Such application shall be made in writing to the Police Department. The Chief of Police is authorized to issue such a permit. The permittee shall be required to place erect flashing light barricades around the truck or other equipment to be left standing upon a street overnight. The permit shall designate the location where such standing is permitted.

Section 7.

The Department of Police is hereby instructed to enforce the terms of this ordinance by appropriate marking of vehicles and the issuance of citations for violations of this ordinance.

Section 8.

The City police are authorized to issue a uniform traffic citation for any violation of this ordinance. The following is the schedule of bail of each violation:

- A. Fire hydrant or fire lane, \$15.00.
- B. Intersections, \$10.00.
- C. Double parking or obstructing public roads, \$5.00.
- D. All other violations, \$2.00.

Section 9.


Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of an offense and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$200.00.

Section 10.


The Council finds that in order to control parking and reduce traffic and pedestrian hazards within the City an emer-

gency exists and this ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage by the Council and signing by the Mayor.

The foregoing ordinance was duly passed by the Council on August 17, 1978.
